



Welcome to Sheppard Point Heyburn Lake Equestrian Trails and Campground



When Is Riding Permitted? Riding in the ~300 Acre Park is permitted year round. All trails **outside of Sheppard Point and Rocky Point (see map)** are in Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs). **Horses are NOT permitted in the WMAs during hunting seasons: Oct. 1 – Jan. 15, April 6 – May 6 and the weekend (Saturday & Sunday) preceding April 6 (Youth Season).**

Special Use Permits – (1) Required for organized rides over 24 people in the WMAs from Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation (ODWC) (okwild@prodigy.net); and (2) for utilization of more than the 7 “horse friendly” campsites (# 131-137) at Sheppard Point from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Heyburn Lake Office at 918-247-6391 or ceswt-odnk@usace.army.mil.

Negative Coggins Certificate Required. -- present this to the Park Ranger or other Park Personnel when requested. **Ride at your own risk.**

Day Use Parking / Trail Head – entrance is located just outside the Park Entrance, North of the Gate Shack.

Overflow Parking – Use only when Day Use Parking Area is full.

No horses are allowed south of the equestrian sites, including the shelter and restrooms.**

***** Riding on roadways is not permitted** except at designated crossings outside the park. Trails are located just inside the tree line on each side of the road for your convenience. Boggy areas can be deceiving. Please stay on the trails at all times for your safety.

Leave No Trace. All riders must distribute manure in the tree line. Please clean up after your horse and keep your site clean at all times. Please remove all hay upon departure. **

Equestrian Camp Sites #s 131-137 are the only designated sites for horses at this time. Picket poles are provided. **No Horses are permitted South and/or West of the Equestrian Camp sites.** ** ***

Trail Access at Equestrian Camp Sites is conveniently located down by the water line behind the picket poles. Always enter and exit trails here when camping. **Do not ride on or along the roadway.**
